Motion to Approve AP Comparative Government

Full Course Description Materials Can be found <u>HERE</u>

- Course Description: AP Comparative Government and Politics introduces students to the rich diversity of political life outside the United States. The course uses a comparative approach to examine the political structures; policies; and political, economic, and social challenges of six selected countries: China, Iran, Mexico, Nigeria, Russia, and the United Kingdom. Students compare the effectiveness of approaches to many global issues by examining how different governments solve similar problems. They will also engage in disciplinary practices that require them to read and interpret data, make comparisons and applications, and develop evidence-based arguments.
- Prerequisites: There are no prerequisites for AP Comparative Government and Politics. Students should be able to read a college-level textbook and write grammatically correct, complete sentences.
- Implementation: AP Comparative Government and Politics could be offered as an elective course for 10th-12th grades or as a possible corequisite course with AP US Government and Politics.
