Standard and Honors United State History Text:

Give Me Liberty, An American History (print source from Norton Books)

by Eric Foner (Author, Columbia University), Kathleen DuVal (Author, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill), Lisa McGirr (Author, Harvard University)

The implementation of this text does not bring in new curriculum or require additional teacher training. It covers US history from colonial times through the modern period. It is written in a more narrative style than the old textbook that we have been using since 2015 making it easier for students to read inside and outside of the classroom. The units also lend themselves to more classroom discussion. Chapters are broken down into easier to understand units than the current book. It aligns with the standard course of study as laid out by the state, which is what my course is designed around.

Teacher Training Needed: Training videos are included that explain how to navigate the program to find all available resources and use the digital tools to assign them to students. Free technical support is provided through chat and email. Professional Development—LIVE 1-hour sessions with 6 times per year plus recorded, virtual, and private options for material familiarization.

The program provides standards-aligned lessons, following the 5E model (Engage, Explore, Explain, Elaborate, Evaluate). Editable, differentiated materials are provided for 21 of the 23 7th grade science standards. While they don't have full units that tie directly to the two missing standards in their NC standards alignment document, I have been able to find resources for those standards in their other available units. Additionally I have resources I've used in the past. Resources for all units include:

- Station labs and inquiry labs.
- Presentations that include guided notes or digital interactive notes, interactive notebook pages.
- Writing prompts and reading passages including differentiated versions.
- WIKI Tickets (What I Know Is) to be used as a quick check like an exit ticket or bell ringer.
- Homework and assessments
- Choice projects
- Extensions for early finishers.
- Engagement ideas for each lesson.
- Anchors in two parts, part 1 the engage, or pre-lesson, materials introduce a phenomenon and are designed to stimulate curiosity before investigating a topic. Part 2 is an explanation of the phenomenon presented in the engagement section and encourages students to apply their knowledge.
- STEM Activities, Graphing
- Escape Rooms, Games, Crossword
- Sub Plans, Posters, Videos

All seventh grade units can be addressed by Kesler Science, 21 of 23 7th grade science standards are complete with resources which can be used to engage students and grow students.

YEAR 1: Intro to Drama

Tuesday/Thursday 1st Elective, both semesters (every T/TH)

Everyone is required to take this level.* An intro PERFORMANCE course that covers all the ACTING tools as well as basic structures and procedures of the theatre. Musical theatre will be integrated in every unit to ensure students are prepared for the most popular theatre art form, especially the singing and dancing components. Students will have a short performance opportunity (still working out the details).

YEAR 2 & 3:Drama

Monday/Wednesday/Friday 1st Elective

Students can take this class after Year 1 Drama. These students will delve into deeper acting tools and will be involved in the middle school drama jr musical or the 6-12 full-length musical, depending on what is planned for that year.
